President's Message

As I write this message in early March 2020 everyone is concerned about the coronavirus. Of course no one knows what its ultimate course will be but all are hoping that as the weather warms it will play itself out as cold weather viral illnesses often do. Please accept my sincere best wishes for your good health and well-being. Remember to wash those hands, even more than you normally do.

When I did the first draft of this message about a week ago I was unsure of how our Annual Meeting scheduled for May 3, 2020 would be affected. Since then it has become clear that we have to postpone our meeting. On March 16, 2020, the Centers for Disease Control released updated guidance to postpone or cancel gatherings with 50 or more people for the next eight weeks which would be until mid-May. The guidance underscores a focus on protecting vulnerable populations, hand hygiene, and social distancing. The Society's Board will determine if we can safely re-schedule in the future or if we will have to cancel this year's Annual Meeting.

Some of you will know of the passing of Brigadier General Connie Slewitzke former chief of the Army Nurse Corps and a long-time Society member. General Slewitzke generously left the Society a large contribution in her trust. A memorial to her follows in this newsletter.

We informed you in our last newsletter about the Society's plans for a reunion in the Rose Garden of the old Walter Reed Army Medical Center property later this year.

Those plans are continuing to take shape as we have signed a contract with an event planner to assist us to insure that this is a successful and enjoyable event. The reunion will be a ticketed event; we have set the ticket price at \$25.00. A Salute to Service, Leadership and Philanthropy

The Walter Reed Society recently received a gift of \$68,000 from the Connie Slewitzke Trust. General Slewitzke was a long-time member of the Society and former Chief, Army Nurse Corps. Below is a brief accounting of her distinguished career.

After graduation from St. Mary's Hospital School of Nursing in Wausau, Wisconsin, she worked for several years in civilian hospitals in the Midwest, California, and Washington, D.C.

Looking for the opportunity of career advancement, enhanced professionalism, and the chance to travel she joined the Army in 1957. Early assignments were at Brooke and Tripler Army Medical Centers, Fort Meade, MD and Korea. Moving into mid-level supervisory roles she served in New Mexico and requested duty in Vietnam where she served with the 36th Evacuation Hospital in Vung Tau after which she became chief nurse of the 6th Convalescent Center in Cam Ranh Bay.

Connie Lee Slewitzke (1931-2019)

After returning from Vietnam and a follow-on assignment in the clinic at Fort Myer, VA she was allowed to

complete her bachelor's degree in nursing 1971. After service in Europe and completion of Command and General Staff College she was assigned to Health Services Command at Fort Sam Houston, Texas, where she ultimately served as nurse consultant.

Following completion of the Army War College, she held successive senior leadership positions in Korea and at Letterman Army Medical Center in San Francisco. In 1980 Slewitzke agreed to serve as assistant chief of the Army Nurse Corps and in 1983 she was promoted to brigadier general and became the 17th chief of the Army Nurse Corps.

She retired in 1987 after 29 years of service. After retirement from the Army she became director of development of the University of Maryland School of Nursing. She later participated in archiving a repository of 17,000 historical photographs in the Army Nurse Corps historian's office at the U.S. Army Center of Military History. She also served as vice-president of the Women in Military Service of America board. Brigadier General Slewitzke resided in Northern Virginia until her death on September 2, 2019.


Walter Reed Society Health Information Management Scholarships

Better Health Information = Better Health. The Walter Reed Society (WRS) is strengthening this concept by providing funding for Health Information Management (HIM) scholarships to the spouses of active duty military, veterans and their spouses, wounded warriors and their spouses and surviving spouses. Since 2015, the WRS has funded seven scholarships for those at the associate, bachelor's and master's level. In 2019, there were five applications for the HIM scholarships and one awarded. The scholarship recipient is a Navy spouse enrolled in an Associate Degree Program at Tidewater Community College in VA which will allow her to sit for the examination to be credentialed as a Registered Health Information Technician (RHIT). She stated that she: *"sincerely thanks the WRS and donors for their generosity effort and encouragement.
