On Sept. 20, 2017, several members of the Walter Reed Society board of directors met with CAPT Mark A. Kobelja, MC, USN, the new director of Walter Reed National Military Medical Center, CAPT John R. Rotruck, MC, USN, chief of staff, and CMC Sean L. Brown, senior enlisted leader, as well as several others of the senior leadership staff. The Society requested the meeting to introduce CAPT Kobelja and his staff to the Society and its work. It was a pleasure to meet with them and present information on the activities of the Society. Our information was well received with CAPT Kobelja commenting that the Stages of Healing music program sponsored by the Society receives more positive comments from patients than any other hospital program.

Several months ago the Society's board of directors started holding a conference call, every other month, to supplement our bi-monthly face-to-face meetings. These conference calls have been well attended and are used to discuss individual topics at length. An outcome of the call on attracting new members was to place an advertisement in "The Journal", published weekly for the hospital staff and patients.

Last year COL (R) Brian Foley, USA, our First Vice President initiated a new program with the American Health Information Management Association Foundation for the WRS to provide scholarships to veterans, their spouses, and spouses of active duty in pursuit of a degree in health information manage-

Wounded Warrior Creates Symbol of Appreciation

Good afternoon, ladies and gentlemen. I would like to thank all those gathered, board members, distinguished guests, and friends for allowing me to share my story of the Walter Reed Society.

My name is Steven Luu, and I am a wounded warrior that is still in the process of healing. For me the journey has already taken years and the road ahead remains long. During my treatment, my therapists have helped me discover that making art would help alleviate my symptoms. I now paint or produce art regularly through glass fusion.

My treatment is helping me stay calm and to rebuild self-confidence through art. This may sound easy, but it was complicated for someone with my symptoms. I needed to be off-post to begin reintegrating with the outside community. I also have transportation challenges. Fortunately, Susan Hill, an instructor at the Glass Art Center in Glen Echo, agreed to accept me as a student. My treatment team also contacted the Walter Reed Society for support. Without any hesitation, the Society sponsored me to attend glass fusion lessons for 12 months at Glen Echo.

At the beginning, I had a difficult time getting back and forth to the lessons. I got lost a few times while changing buses. However, soon I developed more confidence and slowly adapted to traveling off post. My teacher, Sue, also spent a lot of time helping me with glass. I have since discovered my creative side and decided to pursue a degree in fine arts. I will begin a program at George Mason University this fall.


I would like to share another story about the Walter Reed Society. I spend a lot of time at Walter Reed.

Like, a lot. That makes me one of the biggest beneficiaries of the live music that the Walter Reed Society provides throughout the facility. It has always been very peaceful to hear music playing in the lobby and patient waiting areas.

My parents also appreciate everything the Society has done for me. They live in California and they want me to tell you “thank you” for helping me while they are far away. When I was 8 years old, my parents, my brother, and I escaped from Vietnam on a small, crowded boat. After spending 7 years in a foreign refugee camp, we entered the United States as refugees. Ever since, I have felt a strong association with boats.

I would like to present a gift to the Walter Reed Society. I made it myself using glass fusion techniques. It is called the “Walter Reed Society Boat.” As you can see, the sails are in perfect condition. Somehow, the boat is going to travel far. I just want to say thank you so much for all you’ve done and letting me share my story.

Scholarships Available for Warriors



The Walter Reed Society (WRS) has provided \$10,000 to the American Health Information Management Association (AHIMA) Foundation to provide health information management scholarships for: veterans, the wounded, ill and injured, (WII), the spouses of veterans and WII, the spouses of active duty members and surviving spouses. Applications for scholarships for school year 2018 increased to 21, up from last year's 13. Awards have not been made as of this

date for 2018 scholarships; there were five awards last year and we anticipate more being awarded this year.

An increasing number of health information organizations are aware of the unique talents and skills veterans bring to health care. Veterans transition with many technical and common employability skills and make excellent healthcare employees; allowing organizations to address many workplace and workforce challenges facing them in the ever-changing health care and health information landscape. Combining a health information scholarship program with veterans is a win-win situation.


