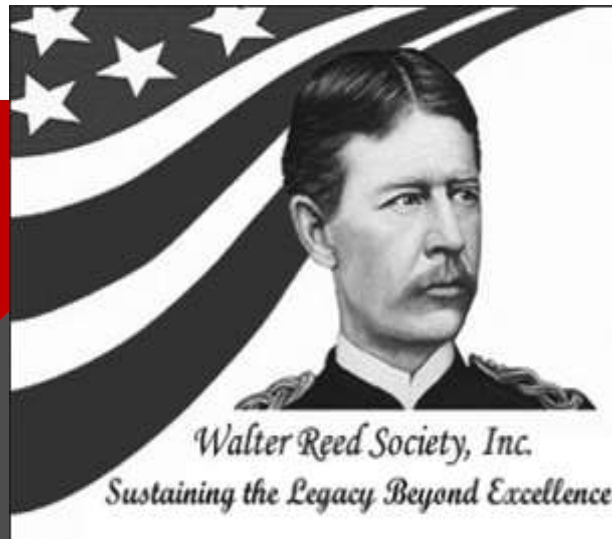

WRS members make possibilities realities. Recent program activity highlights:

PATIENT CARE SUPPORT

Provided custom compression sleeves for a post operative cancer patient at WRNMMC who has lymphedema following a mastectomy.

This compression garment will significantly aid in improving the prevention of infection, pain control, function, and well being for this patient who has significant lymphedema. Regular compression garments are provided by the hospital to patients who need them however this particular patient needed a custom garment and could not afford to buy it herself. Unfortunately, even Medicare does not cover custom compression sleeves so the WRS stepped in to provide this much needed garment.

EDUCATION/SCHOLARSHIP

Award scholarships for Veterans and Spouses.

Since 2015 has funded American Health Information Association (AHIMA) Foundation for Health Information Management (HIM) scholarships to spouses of active-duty military, veterans, their spouses, and surviving spouses.

This year the AHIMA Foundations Scholarship Committee conducted a highly competitive review and selection process—a total of 10 applications were submitted, 4 eligible applications were reviewed. The scholarships were awarded to two students during 2020:

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Assisted with request from Occupational Therapy department for multiple sclerosis patient in need of special equipment.

The individual's mobility is an issue. She has Amazon Alexa ecosystem in her house and she is in need of a Ring system that works with her current equipment. WRS reimbursed her for the cost of the equipment.

Arranged (with assistance) of the American Red Cross to provide 35 meals for ER Nurses Week at WRNMMC in October 2020.

A **Veteran** with four years of military service. Currently, he is a graduate student at Indiana University-Purdue University where he is enrolled in the dual-degree master's program for Health Information Management and Health Informatics. His professional goal is to improve healthcare interoperability and the exchange of information among healthcare organizations. *"This scholarship saved me from getting additional loans,"* he says. *"Thank you so very much for helping veterans like me during times like this."*

COLLABORATIVE PARTNERSHIPS/ MEDICAL EDUCATION/PATIENT CARE

Donation to American Red Cross to Assist the USUHS Family Health Center

Provided a donation of integrative medical equipment to the Red Cross at Walter Reed who loaned the equipment to the Uniformed Services University Family Health Center (FHC). The use of this equipment will significantly expand the ability of the clinic to offer integrative medical therapies to patients for a myriad of medical issues to include; pain management, scar therapy, anxiety, depression, and insomnia. By treating these conditions the clinic is able to fulfill its mission of providing comprehensive care for its patients of all ages. Overall, these devices will decrease the number of referrals submitted for

these conditions, decrease time to care for these patients and improve overall patient health and satisfaction. The equipment will also serve as an educational tool which will model the use of integrative medicine in the comprehensive care of service members and their families. 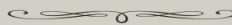

HONORING VANDY MILLER

A Tribute to Friendship and Service

As Vandy Miller approached his 89th birthday, Carlton Hammerer, wanted to honor his best friend of over 30 years. After his professional football career with the Washington team and Vandy after his first career with the Army, they worked together for almost two decades at the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC). Carlton had recruited Vandy to the NRC and later Vandy recruited Carlton to the Walter Reed Society. They formed a classic partnership that led to numerous golf tournaments for wounded and injured warriors. They met John Longenecker (Longenecker Associates) and Bob Plata (BUNZL) who both became great and generous supporters of the WRS.


Over the years, more than \$400,000 was raised for the WRS and over 200 wounded veteran got to play on prestigious golf courses all over the east coast and south.


Carlton reached out to Vandy's friends to honor him on his birthday and many very generously responded. John Longenecker donated \$25,000 and BUNZL has donated over \$10,000. All together over \$36,000 has been donated to date to honor Vandy. Sadly Vandy died the day after his 89th birthday but Carl did get to tell him about this honor and thoughtfulness from his many friends.

IN MEMORIAM — Our Society Board Members



Colonel Vandy Miller, US Army (Retired), long-time member and board member of the Walter Reed Society, died on February 17, 2021, one day after his 89th birthday. Born in Wadesboro, North Carolina, he received his BS degree in 1954 from West Virginia State University (WVSU) as distinguished military graduate and was commissioned in the US Army. He received his MS in Radiation Biology from The University of Rochester in 1961. Vandy served in the US Army for 24 years retiring after serving as the Radiological Hygiene Consultant to the US Army Surgeon General. After retirement from the Army, Vandy took a position with the US Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) where he became a member of the Senior Executive Service. During his 18 years with the NRC he was awarded a Presidential Rank Award. In addition to being inducted into the WVSU Athletics Hall of Fame, Vandy was awarded an Honorary Doctor of Humanities Degree from WVSU in 2014. He was very active in a number community services in addition to the WRS such as the Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, the Bethany House Senior Citizen Condominiums, and the Metropolitan Washington Chapter of West Virginia State University. Vandy was extremely dedicated to his church, the 12th Street Christian Church where he served as Deacon, Trustee, Elder and Presiding Elder for over 40 years. Vandy and Sylvia, his wife of almost 59 years, who died in March 2012, had three children, four grandchildren and three great-grandchildren. 

Master Chief John Frankenburg, US Navy (Ret) Long-time Walter Reed Society board member John P. Frankenburg, 74, passed away at his home on November 6, 2020, after a long illness. He was a native of Toledo, Ohio. John retired from the U.S. Navy as Master Chief after 34 years of service. After retirement from the Navy John continued to serve at the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences within the USU Brigade. In addition to the WRS, he was an active member of Northside Christian Church, the York County Historical Society, the Fleet Reserve Association Branch 173, and the American Legion. John is survived by his wife of 22 years, Cindy Frankenburg; three children and six beloved grandchildren. A memorial service was held on Sunday, November 15, 2020, in Newport News, VA. Interment in Arlington National Cemetery was on March 22, 2021. 



IN MEMORIAM — *Our Society Members*

SERVICE.

Long-time WRS member and donor, **Philip K. Russell, M.D. Major General USA (Ret)**, passed away on 21 January 2021 at the age of 88. During his 30-year career in the US Army Medical Corps, he had a succession of research assignments at the Walter Reed Army Institute of Research (WRAIR) and its overseas laboratories ultimately becoming Commandant of WRAIR. After promotion to General Officer he commanded Fitzsimons Army Medical Center as well as the US Army Medical Research and Development Command. After retiring from the Army, he joined Johns Hopkins School of Hygiene and Public Health as professor of international health and began his 30-years of service to non-profit organizations focused on developing vaccines to combat infectious diseases. Dr. Russell is survived by his wife of 65 years, Constance Rice Russell: three children, six grandchildren, and three great grandchildren. A private service with full military honors was held on January 28, 2021 at Fort Logan, Colorado.

LEADERSHIP.

WRS member and international known urologist **David G. McLeod, COL MC USA (Ret)** died in December 2020. He was 85. David's service of over 40 years active duty included time in both the US Marine Corps and US Army. In Viet Nam he served as a clearing platoon leader and medical company commander with the 1st Brigade, 101st Airborne Division earning a Combat Medical Badge. Afterwards he trained in urology and became a visionary leader in the field. Dr. McLeod ushered in a new era of prostate cancer research, combining molecular biology and clinical research at a time when there was increasing focus and controversy over prostate cancer's optimal treatment. His many publications, contributions, recognitions and awards are too numerous to mention here but needless to say he was a true giant in the Army and in medicine.

HONOR.

Kenneth P Butke, LTC, MSC US Army (Ret) passed away on 26 May 2020. After graduation from the University of Akron he was commissioned from ROTC as a 2nd Lieutenant in the Medical Service Corps. He served on active duty for 22 years with two tours in Vietnam. He was predeceased by his wife, Diane, a retired Colonel in the US Army Nurse Corps and former Assistant Chief Nurse at Walter Reed Army Medical Center. He served the WRS as Treasurer. Inurnment was at Arlington National Cemetery.
