#### WRS COMMUNITY BULLETIN

To Our Members, Supporters and Friends:

In December 2022 the Walter Reed Society experienced a disruption in our email service. For a time, our account was off-line and non-functional. As a matter of caution, our then host e-mail provider -- Rackspace Technology-- shut down about 30,000 customers' systems to identify and to resolve suspicious activity. Because we did not know how long it would take to safely and securely come on-line again we moved to another host e-mail provider. That provider remains in place.

The forensic investigation of Rackspace has been completed; there is no evidence that "the threat actor actually viewed, obtained, misused or disseminated" any of the Walter Reed Society's members or customers' emails or data in any way. There is no evidence that our WRS e-mail itself was compromised, that any members' information was compromised or that any PayPal information was compromised. We continue to appreciate your ongoing support.

The Walter Reed Society received a request from a case manager at the Military Advanced Training Center at WRNMMC concerning a patient diagnosed with a brain tumor. The patient travels back and forth from his home to WRNMMC for treatment. At this time he is wheelchair bound, however his home is not wheelchair accessible making it very difficult to transport him in and out of the house. Recently an emergency necessitated that he be rushed to WRN-

MMC and neighbors were needed to help carry him to the car. Fortunately they were available.

After consultation with a local ramp expert it was determined that a ramp was possible and would be helpful. There was an option to rent the ramp and the WRS agreed to provide this needed support for this patient and his family. Because of the urgent need and the patient's condition WRS was able to have the ramp installed in less than a week from the initial contact by the case manager.

Due to the past year's staffing shortages, patients were sometime sent from the ED at WR to the ED at Ft. Belvoir Community Hospital by ambulance for



evaluation and treatment. If discharged home, some had no way to get back to their residence other than by taxi. American Red Cross asked if WRS could assist, and we forged an agreement with Barwood Taxi and Regency Cab. WRS provided vouchers to get a taxi ride back home without out of pocket cost.

#### **PLUE STAR Blue Star Families Extend Thanks To The WRS**

Many lives were touched and made better by your generosity," wrote Julie Riggs, National Capital Region Chapter Director for Blue Star Families. Last year the WRS provided a grant to the chapter in support of military families in the area. The Society is pleased to have received their report on how the monies were used.

Empowering and linking caregivers, teaching and nurturing creative writing, donating books to children, and helping with a festive holiday party were highlighted in the recent impact chapter report. The Blue Star Families National Capital Region Chapter hosted 77 events that reached and involved 7400 service members, spouses and neighbors.

Empowering caregivers by hosting several meetings over the year helped caregivers form friendships and share experiences. These meetings helped many who shared one person's simple and profound statement, "Being a caregiver is very isolating." Twenty-five military caregivers met several times over the year, and a useful network was created. Sharing successful results and sharing frustrating problems laid groundwork for future ways to connect with other caregivers who face challeng-

Creative writing workshops, held virtually, reached over 900 people over the year. The virtual format allowed more people to participate,

especially since many people were not able to attend in person. In December 2022, 180 people signed up for the workshop. The Blue Star Families report defined the value of these workshops, as they "provided a safe space for reflection, connection across differences, and self-expression."

The National Capital Chapter forged more ties with the Exceptional Family Member Program at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center. The donation of more than 200 books at four events at the Bethesda Child Development Center was a meaningful way to reach children.

The Stars, Strips and Snowflakes Holiday Party, held at the BAE Systems building in Falls Church created memories for many children who visited Mrs. Claus' General Store, Elves' Fun & Games, Rudolph's Restaurant and Santa's Workshop. Creating such activities gave children happy holiday experiences.

The Blue Star Families report reflects how the WRS grant funds definitively created ways for patients and their families, friends, and neighbors to share and to connect, bridging caregivers and patients through numerous events and the power of connecting with each other.
