


Remembering WRS Founding Member — Rose Mologre

Our beloved Rose Mologne, one of seven charter members of the Walter Reed Society, passed away peacefully on April 1, 2022. Rose—born June 27, 1931, in Connellsville, PA—was 90. After graduating from The Pennsylvania State University

she became a registered dietician. Working as a **dietitian** at the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center, she met her future husband, West Point graduate Lewis Aspey Mologne, then a medical student in the university's school of medicine. They married June 18, 1960 and subsequently had five children, three sons and two daughters who survive her along with 9 grandchildren.

In-Patient Pediatric Art Project
















tary Medical Center (WRNMMC). Another project was recently completed, a long-anticipated art project for the inpatient pediatric ward. Initially started as a project to help a single pediatric cancer patient who came to Walter Reed from Okinawa via Tripler Army Medical Center, this art therapy project revolutionized the environment of the inpatient pediatric ward at WRNMMC visually improving the environment of the 3 West Unit to which 17 clinical services admit their patients. The initial project placed art work done by pediatric patients on the walls for others to see and soon became a morale booster for the patients, families, and staff. The spontaneous "art show" with pieces simply taped to the hospital walls needed a new home and setting. At that point, the inspiration to develop an integrated, therapeutic, and sustainable, environment with a continuous art show (that was hospital and fire code compliant) became the passion of art therapist, Kristin Ramsey. Ward staff voted for a jungle theme incorporating soothing colors and comforting animals. (cont. page 5)

Unfortunately, administrative and other delays caused the project to drag-on for almost two years. But during this down-time, the African animal artwork of Leah Beach was 'discovered,' and she was engaged to create the new vision for the pediatric unit. It was determined by the facility that the artist would not be allowed to paint directly onto the walls, but the original artwork could be transferred onto wallpaper. After a great deal of searching and with the help of Linda Wolf from Mission M4, a wonderful vendor copied the artwork and exploded the life-like African animals onto wallpaper as 8 foot murals in a savannah setting. The images transformed the entire ward into a harmonious, therapeutic environment which now enlightens all who enter the unit. Finally, cabinets were hung to properly display the art work of the patients, family members, and staff who provided the inspiration for this major renovation. There are many things beyond the control of the patients and families who spend time in the hospital. Redoing the walls in a cohesive jungle theme and securing the continuation of a unit wide art show which pulls in patients, families, and staff will mean that everyone there is enveloped in a space designed specifically to support them through what might be some of the most difficult days their lives.

Through this program Veterans are eligible to receive up to \$10,000 in scholarships to purse associate's, bachelor's, or master's degrees in health information management (HIM) or health informatics (HI). In 2021, six Veterans were awarded scholarships; applications are still under review for 2022. The odds of being awarded a scholarship are above 50% for eligible participants, and even higher for Veterans!

The Foundation has been running the scholarship program for over 20 years and looks forward to continuing this program for years to come. The AHIMA Foundation will be revamping this program in 2023 to streamline the application process and encourage additional applicants. Applications will open in February 2023. Please help the Foundation spread the word about this excellent opportunity.

Stagg Award Honors for Carlton Kammerer WRS Liaison for Sports and Recreation



Carlton Kammerer has served for many years as the Liaison for Sports and Recreation for the Walter Reed Society. Since 2010 Kammerer has assisted in raising nearly \$375,000 for the Walter Reed Society through golf tournaments with former NFL players and wounded veterans. In April 2022 he received the University of the Pacific's Amos Alonzo Stagg Award recognizing a former Pacific student-athlete who has achieved significant distinction in their life through the notable examples of integrity, dedication, idealism, and team spirit that Mr. Stagg personified. The legendary football player and coach Amos Alonzo Stagg coached at Pacific for many years. Kammerer played three seasons with the University of the Pacific Tigers and was drafted in the second round of the 1960 NFL Draft. He played linebacker for 9 years in the NFL including seven years with the Washington Redskins and two with the San Francisco 49ers.

After his retirement in 1969, Kammerer worked in numerous federal government positions, including as a senior executive at the Atomic Energy Commission and its successor agency, the United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission. He was a charter member of the federal government's Senior Executive Service. It was in this position that he met COL (Retired) Vandy Miller who became a great friend and partner at wounded warrior golf tournaments.
